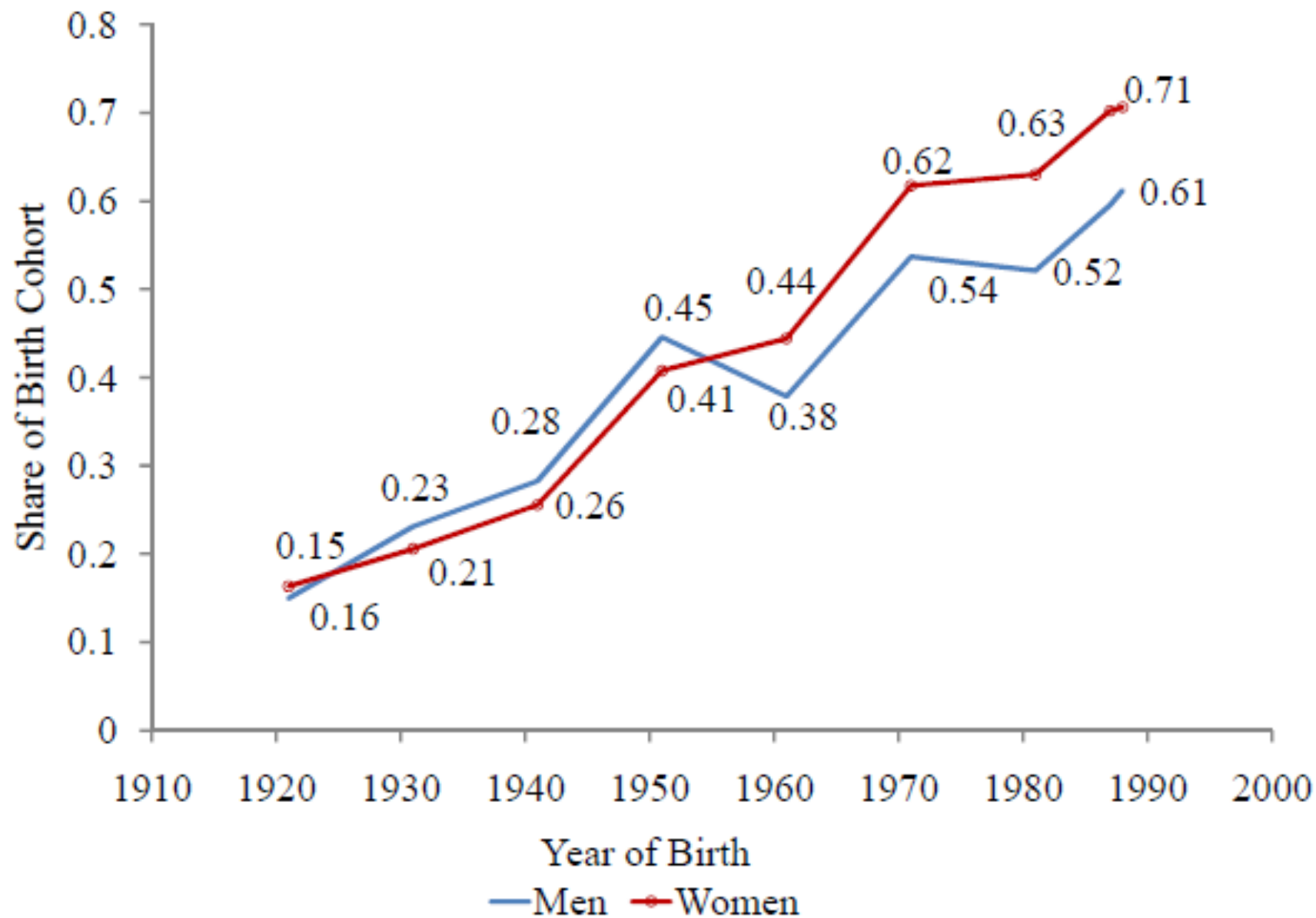

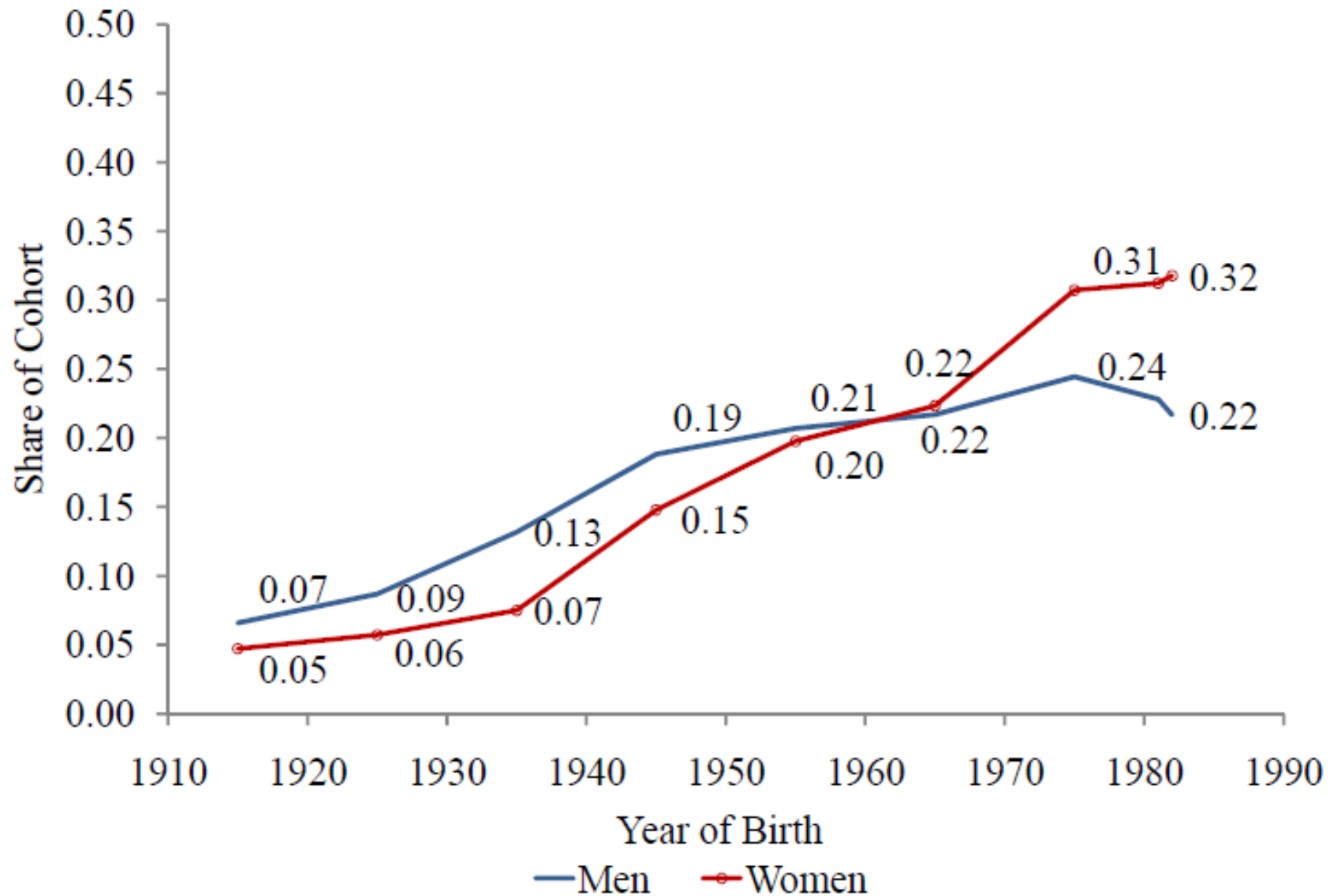

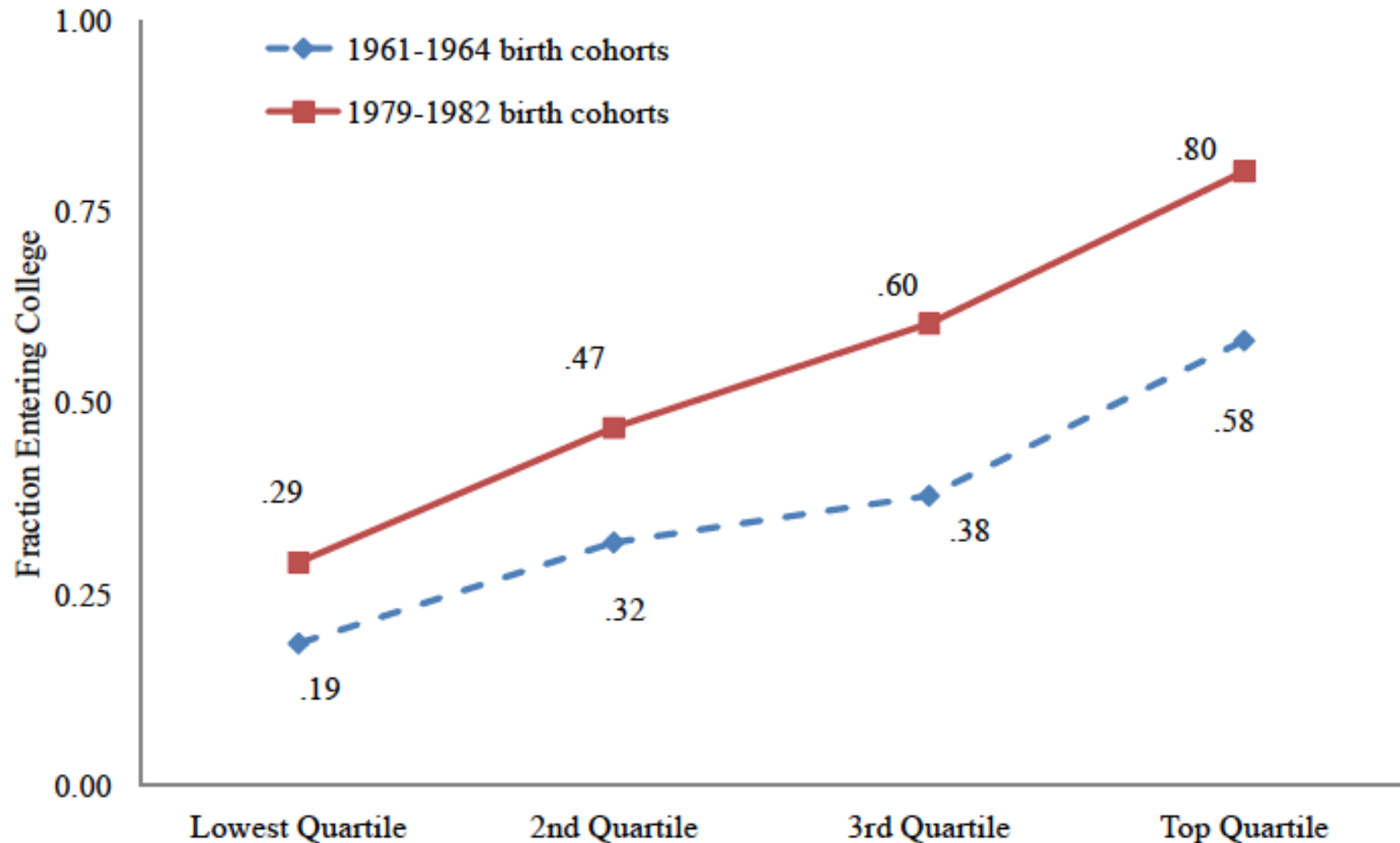

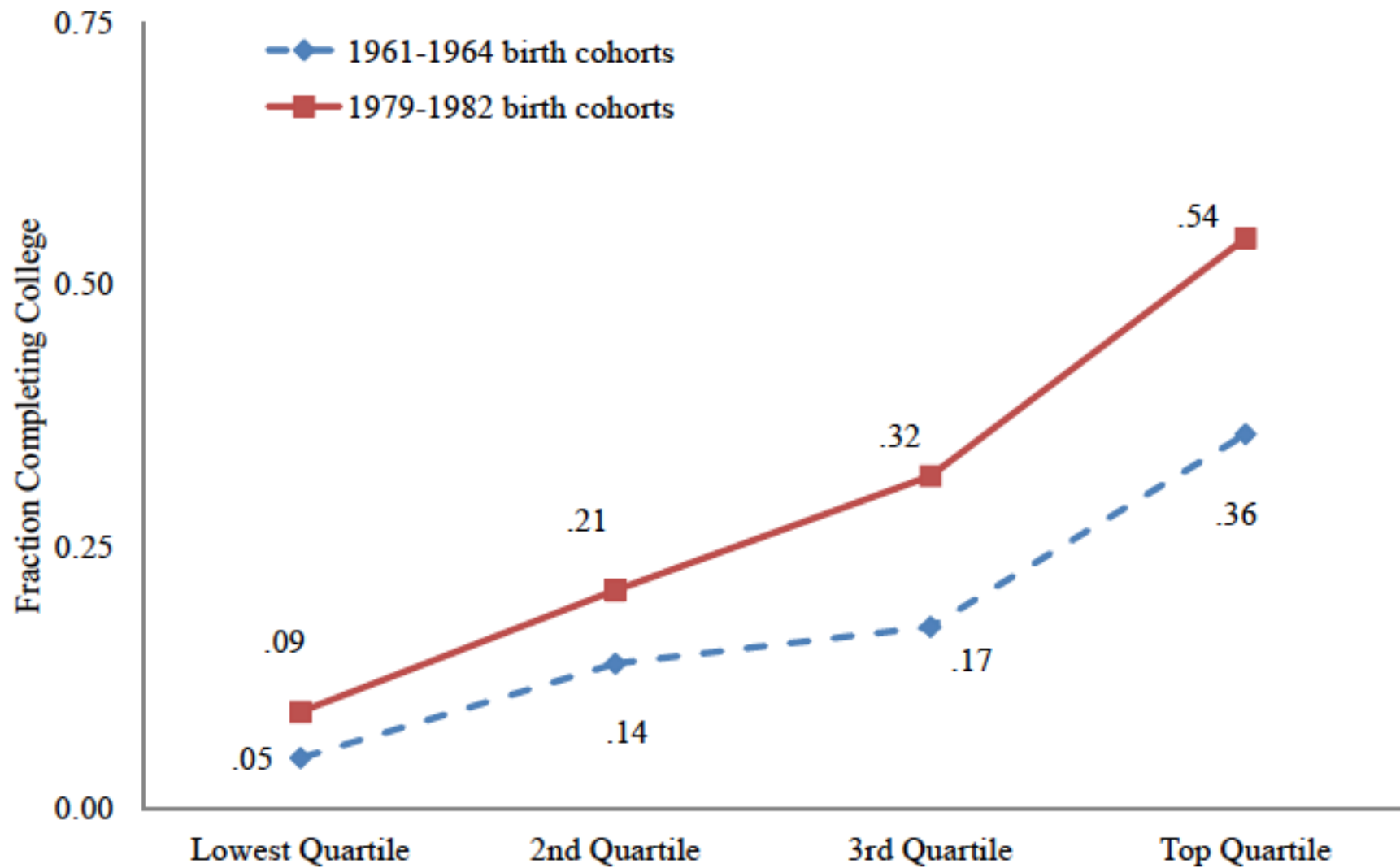


Attendance, by Income

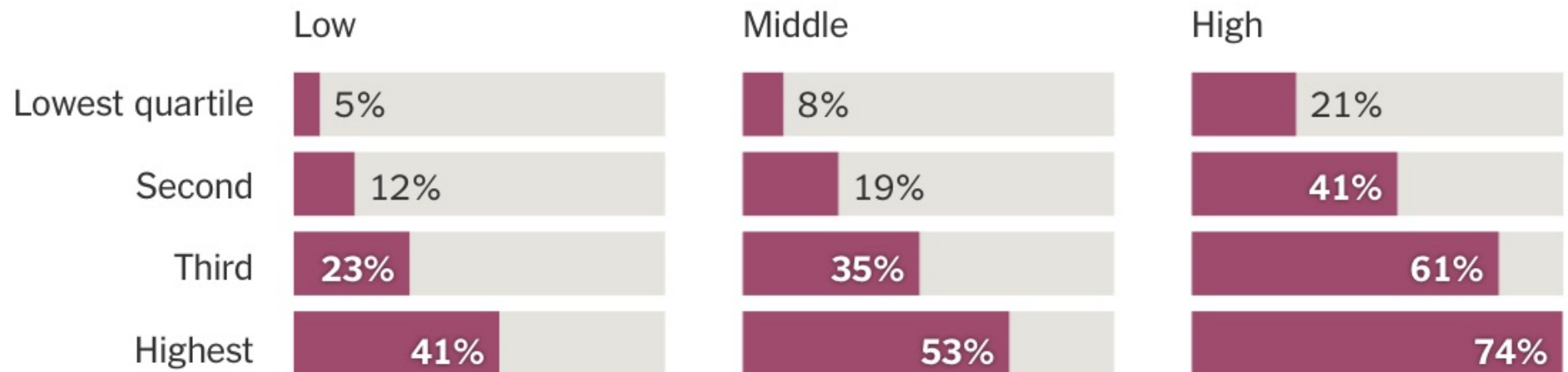

BA Gaps Conditional on Scores

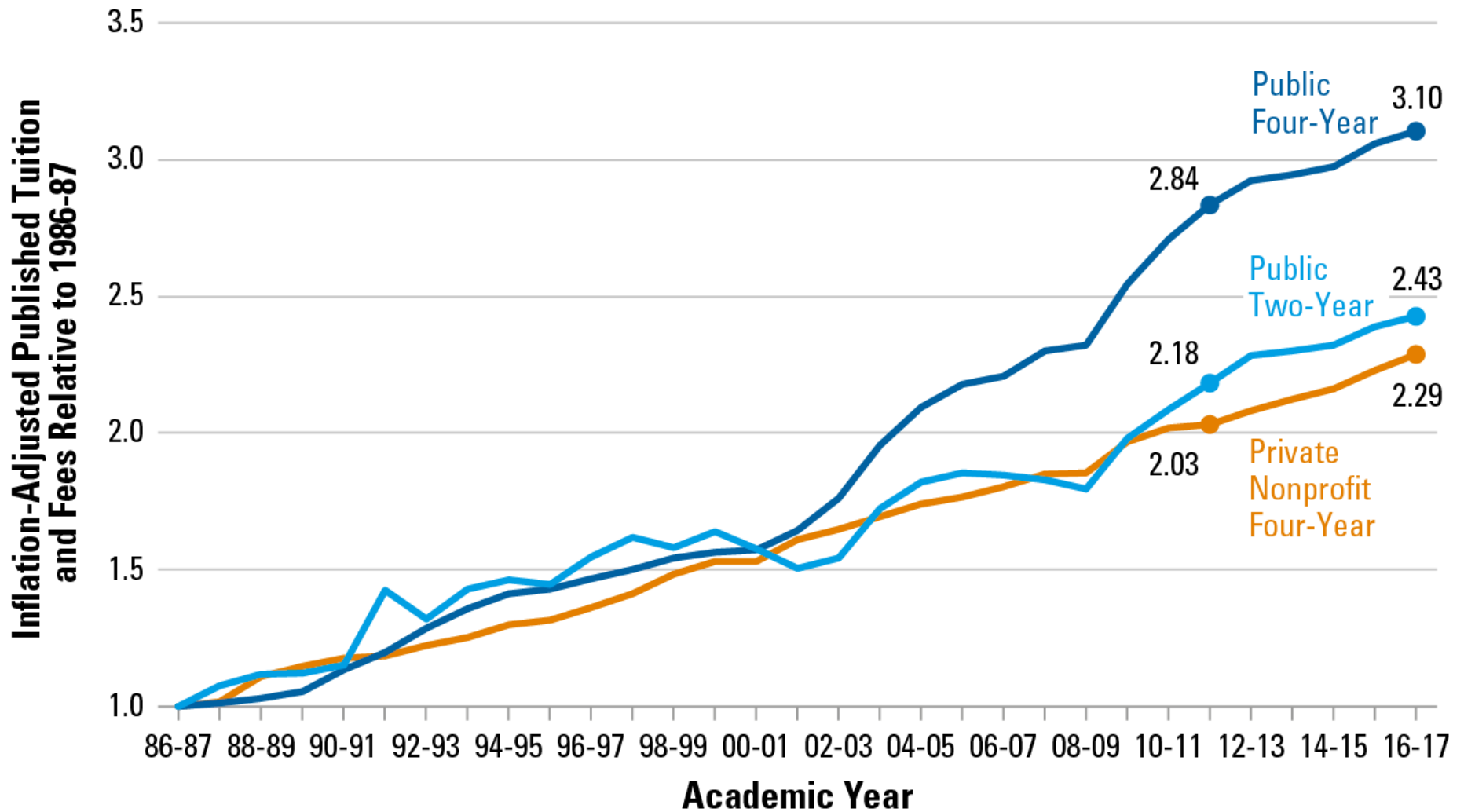
A low-income college student with top math scores has the same chance of graduating with a bachelor's degree (41 percent) as a rich student with mediocre scores.

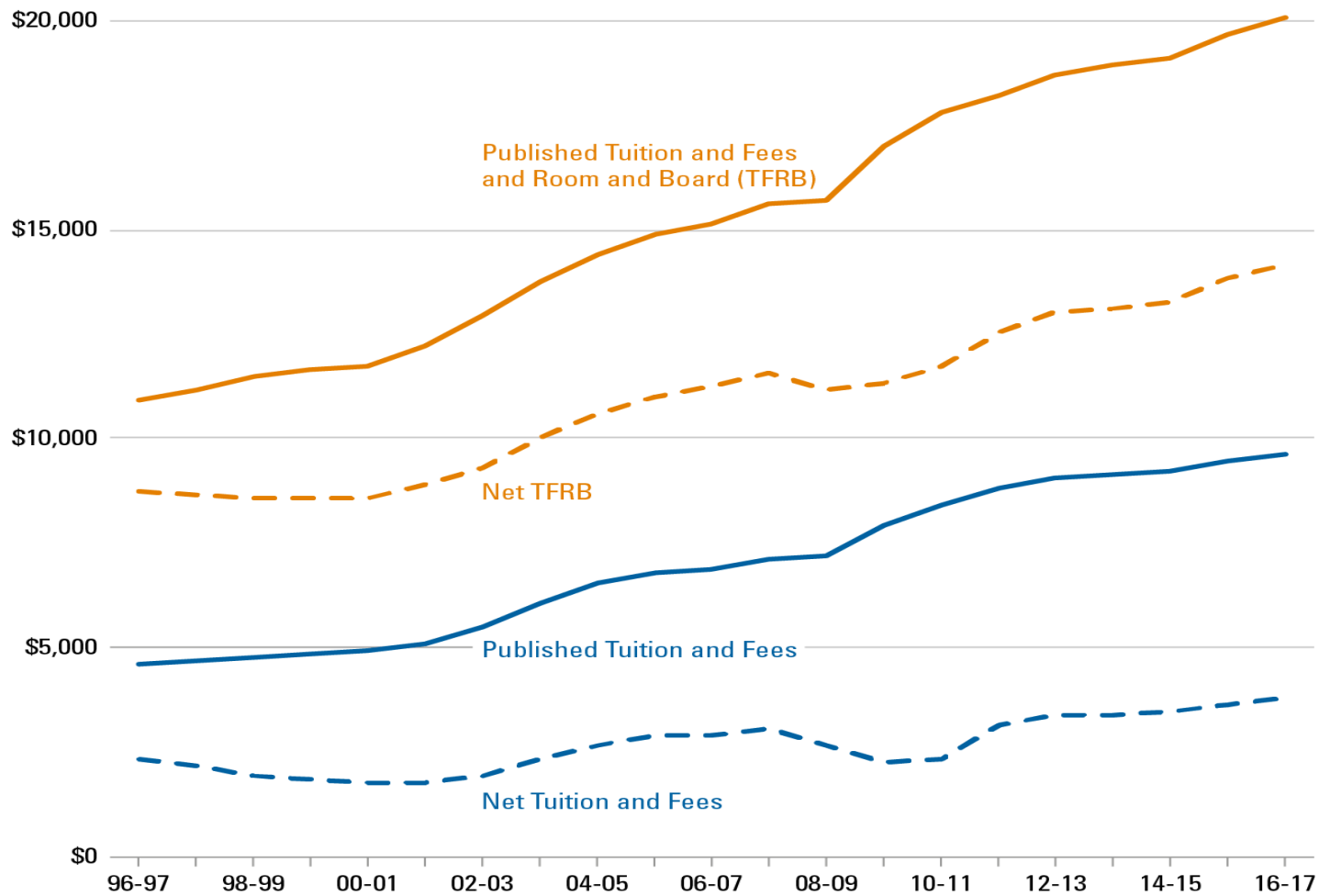

Prices Net of Aid

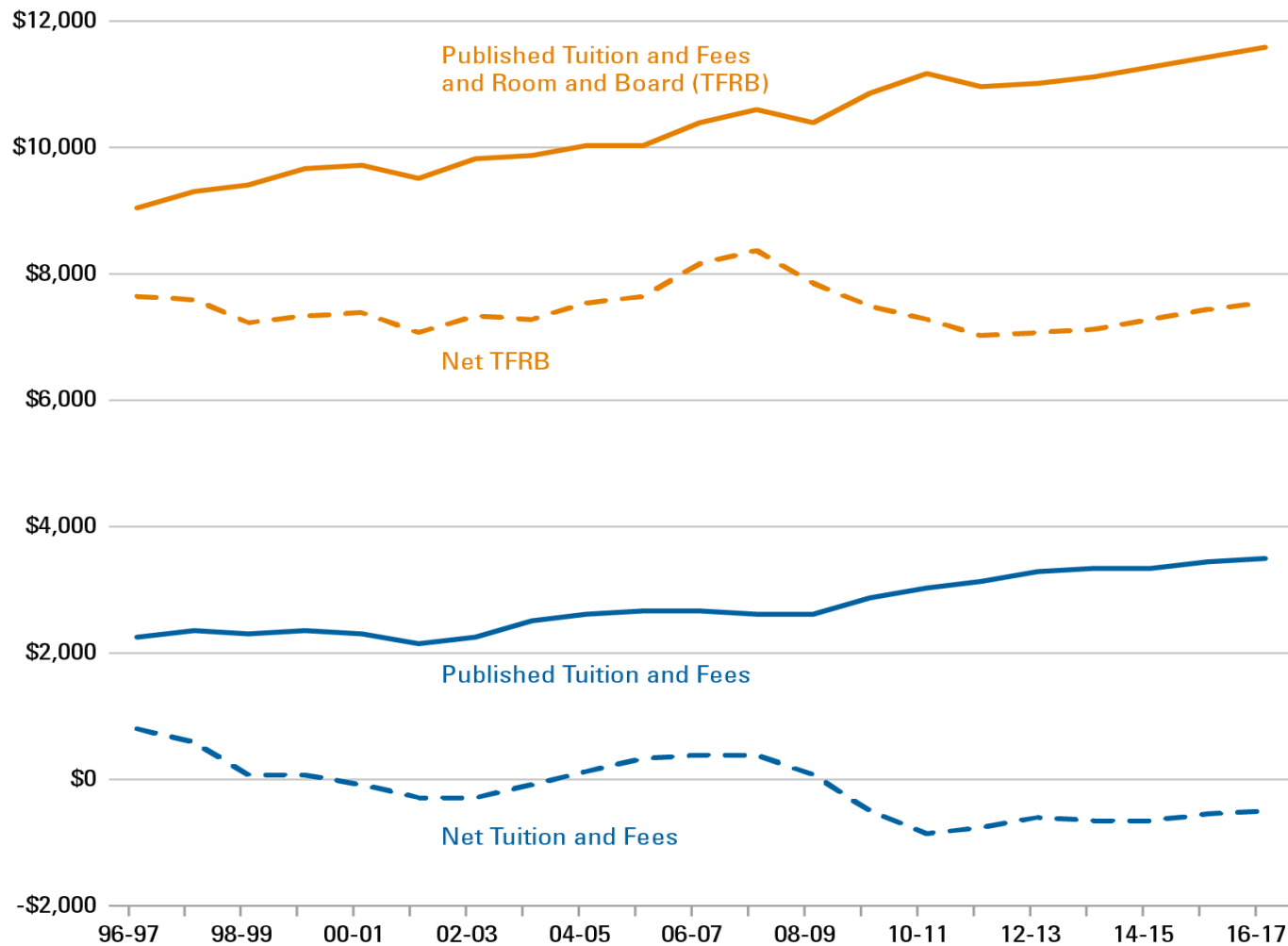
Public Four-Year Colleges

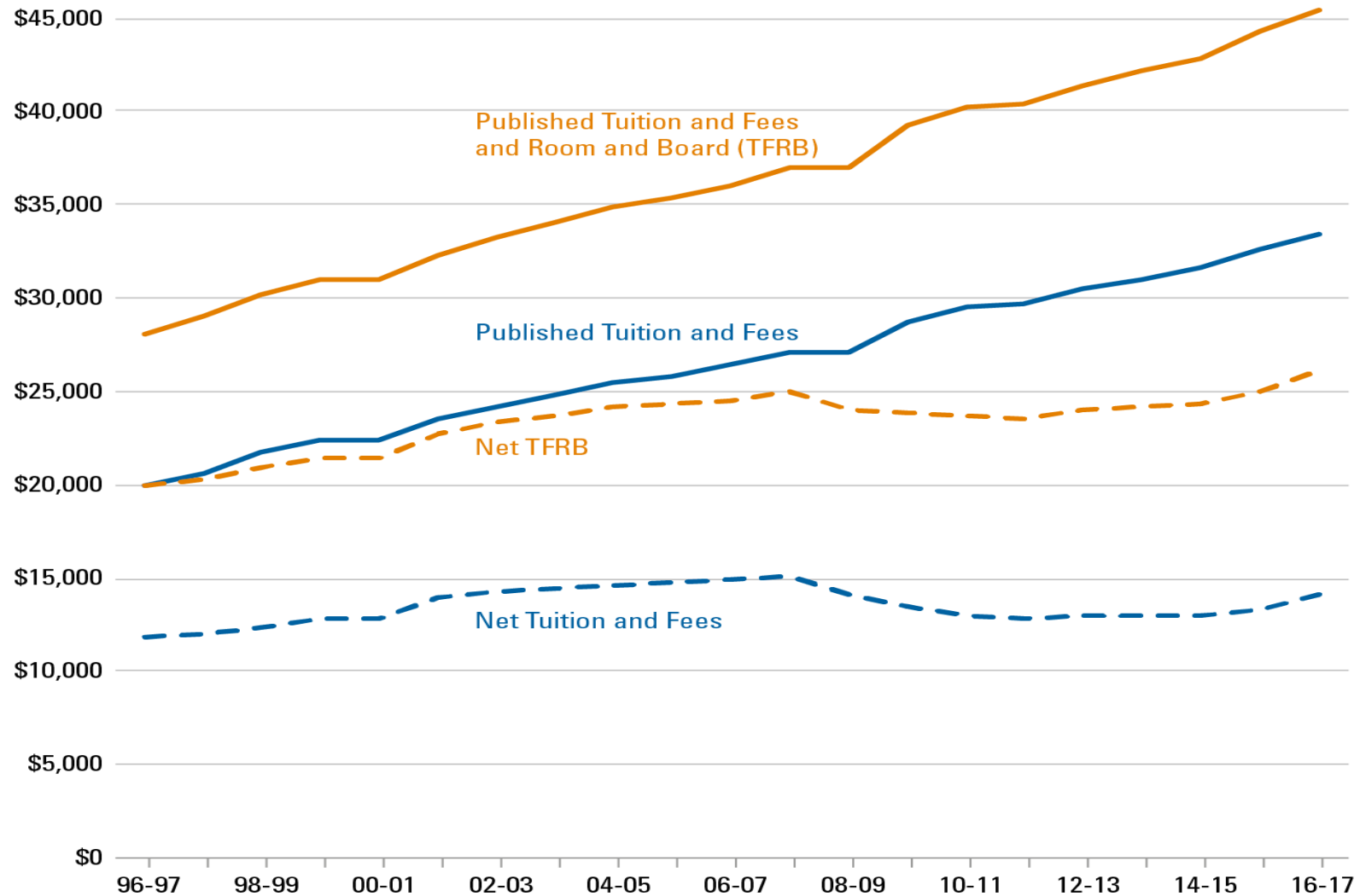
Public Two-Year Colleges
